

Cartographer publishes new map of St. Maarten

PHILIPSBURG--Cartographer Michal Kasprowski has published a new and revised 2013 edition of his St. Maarten/St. Martin street map.

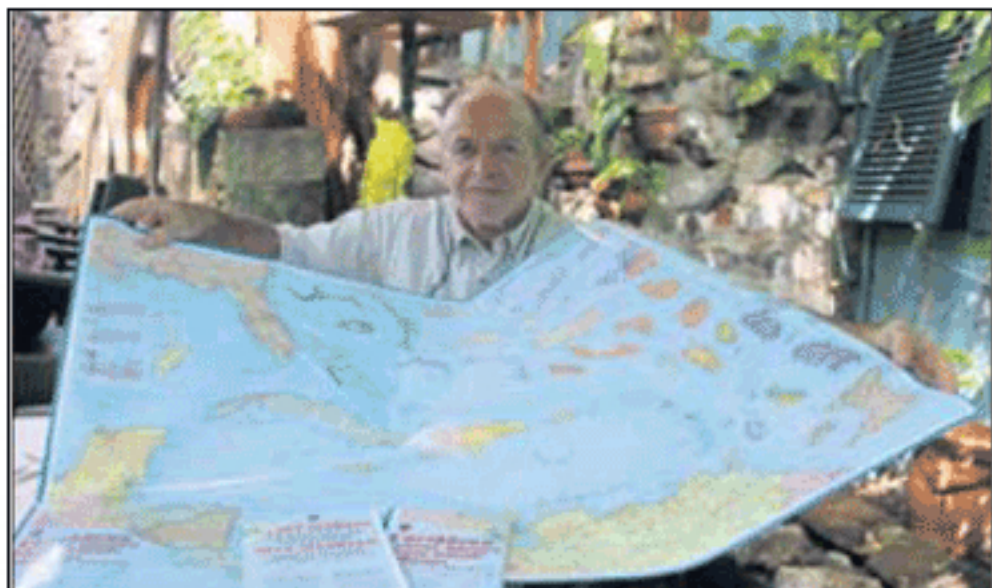
The detailed map with index, made on a 1:15,000 scale, provides many details on both sides of the islands, including separate street maps of the capitals Philipsburg and Marigot.

Residents and visitors may also find other information on the foldable map such as hiking trails and diving sites.

The 88.5 by 103 centimetre full-colour map is extremely rich in topographical detail, indicating main and secondary roads and (new) streets, but also bridges, parking areas, reefs, geological formations, natural reserves, airports, marinas, ports, ferry lines, churches, cemeteries and other points of interest.

Depth curves, soundings in meters, longitude and latitude lines are also provided. The inclusion of district borders is one of the new features of this map.

The revised St. Maarten map is not the only publication of the Polish map

maker, who has called St. Maarten his home since 2002.

In a similar layout as the map of St. Maarten, maps are also available of Anguilla, St. Barths, St. Lucia and Dominica. Maps of Antigua and Barbuda and St. Kitts and Nevis will be available in the future. All maps are based on official data provided by the islands' government departments.

Kasprowski said he is also working on maps of St. Eustatius and Saba. "I have completed my own research for over two years already. The maps are ready, but I'm still waiting on the official street names on these islands. However, despite numerous requests I still have had

no response from the Street Name Committees. This is really a shame, because my maps would be very helpful to visitors and tourists and would make good promotion," Kasprowski stated.

The cartographer also made a 1:4,000,000 scale geographical wall map of the Caribbean and Central America. This map is equally rich in detail and provides, for instance, over 100 cruise line ports of call.
